We are proud to have helped Together for Children to reach the goal of Outstanding!

TfC listens, helps and supports young people. TfC is a family, staff want to talk to you, listen to you, respect and trust you. Everyone gets treated fairly as individuals and staff offer support and guidance. TfC is like our second family. Staff have helped us get back on the right path and they give you the right advice if you need it.

Our groups want to make change to ensure Sunderland is a better, safer place. We have been involved in the Change the Language campaign as certain words made us feel like 'things' and 'objects'. Through the Make your Mark vote, we have been involved in a homelessness campaign where we helped to distribute care packs to a food bank with a focus on low-income families. We have been getting the word out there with leaflets about our group Cozmic 3piphany and our logo that gives us an identity and we are having a stall at the PRIDE festival and marching as a group. We have also helped to run holiday and activity events where we got involved with surfing on the beach and rock pooling. We would like more children and young people to get involved and for us to leave a legacy.

We experience challenges in Sunderland, but we see positives in the way that Together for Children supports everyone in a family as well as the child or young person. Our groups are driven by us young people, we take the lead and do a lot ourselves with help from staff. We want to grow and be successful – we are proud to come from Sunderland!

#### A message from the Chair of the Board, Tammy Banks

We are excited to share with you our next phase of work in the Together for Children family through our business plan 2022 – 2025. Before I look forward, I want to reflect backwards on our journey and recognise the impact TfC has had on children, young people, and families over the last few years. In 2021, our children's services were rated 'Outstanding' by Ofsted, they found our services to be making a real and significant difference. We have, for example increased accommodation for children and young people, opening a 3 bed children's home Nook Lodge in 2021 and Cliff Park accommodation to support young people towards independence. The Mockingbird Model was developed to strengthen support to Foster Carers and the Wear Together project launched to help young people on the edge of care to stay with their families. TfC also changed its language to be more accessible, personal, and inclusive following a campaign led by our young people.

Central to our success was the voice and influence of our children, our strengthened partnership arrangements and above all our highly skilled and talented workforce who continue to innovate, lead and perform to an incredible standard that makes us immensely proud.

As we look to the future we recognise that there are challenges ahead, both for the people of Sunderland and TfC as an organisation. However, we are committed to continuous improvement, and will keep looking for the most effective way to utilise our resources, be creative and value our people. We will always keep children, young people and families at the heart of our decision making and innovation; we are ambitious because we believe they deserve every opportunity to succeed. We are delighted to share our business plan with you and look forward to the next phase of our journey.

#### About Ms

Together for Children was created in April 2017 to deliver Children's Services on behalf of Sunderland City Council. We provide children's social care services, early help, prevention and targeted youth services, education and SEND services and we are responsible for our own finance, workforce, property and support services.

We work closely with the Council and our partners to ensure we meet children's needs. Since 2017, we have grown our services, developed our workforce, transformed how we use our property, data and intelligence, expanded our residential capacity and achieved an Ofsted 'Outstanding' judgement for our children's social care services.

The Board provides support and challenge on the direction and strategy of Together for Children and comprises:






#### Cozmic 3phiphany - LGBTQ+:



Our Highlighted Achievements 2023
- Empowering children & Young People

- Our Young Commissioners produced a short film to evaluate the Breathing Space programme. The film was shown at a national event in London hosted by the DfE.
- SEND STARS co-produced the 'My Best Life' website launched to provide information including the SEND Local Offer and to book events taking place across Family Hubs.
- The STARS group provided views around their experiences of school transition processes as part of a successful bid for £1,000 000 to fund a SEND Transformation Programme across the local area.
- LGBTQ+ group Cozmic 3piphany organised the Sunderland Family Pride event 'Wear Here 4 Pride' with TfC and SCC to promote inclusion across the city.
- Sunderland Youth Council held the Make your Mark 2024 ballot, receiving 6746 votes from young people across the city.

- Young commissioners have completed Quality
  Assurance visits during HAF delivery and
  have contributed to the design, delivery, and
  evaluation of HAF.
- Children and young people are engaged with TfC and the Council on a city-wide Low Carbon Framework and are providing their views to support and shape this agenda.
- 1,552 children and young people have engaged in a participation activity and contributed to decision making.
- We have revised our local offer to provide young people with information about participation activities and getting involved in their community.



# Our Highlighted Achievements 2023 - Supporting workforce and making best use of resources

- Vacancy rates and Turnover are well below the regional and national average reflecting stability across the TfC workforce. Agency usage is 0.1% of established workforce.
- All Newly Qualified Social Workers who qualified in 2023 have moved into permanent posts across the service.
- We have introduced Domestic Abuse Champions as part of introducing a Domestic
   Abuse Policy and our commitment to the White Ribbon Campaign.
- We launched a Fair Treatment Policy with ACAS trained Fair Treatment Ambassadors to support workers to report discrimination/ harassment or unfair treatment.
- TfC has been shortlisted for several prestigious workforce awards recognising the innovation and excellence within the TfC workforce in 2023 and 2024

- TfC has achieved Gold Better Health at Work accreditation; recognising the value of health and wellbeing activity to employees and the overall organisational culture.
- We have opened two new children's homes and work is ongoing to open a further 2 and 1 short breaks home for Children with Disabilities over the next 12 months.
- 6 children's homes were inspected and 5 were rated good or outstanding. Columbo Road Children's home was rated Outstanding for the 6th consecutive year.
- Derwent Hill continues to be Nissan's Training provider for Leadership and Team Development Programmes and has now been confirmed as a Duke of Edinburgh's Award Approved Activity Provider.



Our Highlighted Achievements 2023
- Inspiring creative and innovative practice

- We have 5 Family Hubs now operating across the city, providing an integrated wrap around service for the whole family, overseen though a multi-agency governance model.
- TfC has been one of 8 areas in the country involved in the DfE funded 'Family Network Support Project' and to has supported 28 families providing funding of over £28,700.
- We have recruited a Dads' worker who has been working with Dads where a need for support has been identified.
- Fostering Sunderland now has four Mockingbird constellations that nurture relationships between children and their foster families.
- TfC has led on the development of the new regional working approach to fostering recruitment, North East Fostering Pathfinder.

- We have introduced an early intervention programme provided by the Foundation of Light for Key Stage 1 and 2 children with emerging SEMH needs.
- Derwent Hill's is providing high quality outdoor residentials for young people from Sunderland and is recognised as one of the premier centres in the UK.
- Targeted Youth Services have been involved with the Focussed Deterrent Project to reduce serious youth violence in Sunderland city centre.
- In 2023/24 the Prevention Bus engaged 5,158 children and young people both within school and the community.
- 8,572 children and young people engaged in our Holiday Activity and Food Programme


# Our Highlighted Achievements 2023 - Leading and influencing future policy and direction

- Our Delivering Better Value in SEND programme of work is identifying and implementing local and national opportunities to improve the outcomes for children and young people with SEND.
- Our SEND Team has joined an advisory steering group focused on the digitalisation of EHCPs and is sharing experiences nationally.
- We are leading the development of the Sunderland Family Hub and Start to Life Model, which is a multi-agency approach, providing an integrated wrap around service for families.
- Our Early Years Team have further developed the support and intervention offered to childminders and PVI sector, improving outcomes for children in these provisions and encouraging more childminders into the sector.

- The Let's Talk Change event, planned by the Regional Children in Care Council saw young people from our Change Council sharing their views at a regional level and contributing to the local offer for young people so that all young people receive the same support no matter where they live.
- TfC and Sunderland City Council recognise 'Care Experience' as a protected characteristic and more recently in signing the Employer Care Leavers Covenant






#### Our governance
