

# Two Year Early Education Funding – Families receiving additional government support

### Who is eligible?

Many families across Sunderland can benefit from funded early education places for two-year-olds if they meet the relevant eligibility criteria:

The family are in receipt of:

- Income Support
- Employment and Support Allowance Income Related
- income based Job Seekers Allowance
- guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit with an annual net earnings threshold of £15,400
- are in receipt of Child Tax and/or Working Tax Credit and have a household income below thethreshold of £16,190
- are in receipt of the Working Tax credit 4 week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

### The child:

- is cared for by the local authority
- has a current Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- has left the care of the local authority through arrangements for SpecialGuardianship or Residence Order or through Adoption

# Non-UK citizens who cannot claim benefits (No Recourse to Public Funds)

If a family are non-UK citizens and their immigration status states that they have 'no recourse to public funds', they may be able to get a place. They must live in England and their household income must be no more than:

- £26,500 for families with one child; or
- £30,600 for families with two or more children.

The family cannot have more than £16,000 in savings or investments.

## When can the place start?

If your child is eligible, you can start claiming funded childcare the term after your child turns 2, depending on when their birthday is.

- Children born between **1** April and **31** August will be eligible to a place in the **Autumn** term beginning on or after **1** September
- Children born between **1 September and 31 December** will be eligible to a placein the **Spring** term beginning on or after **1 January**
- Children born between **1 January and 31 March** will be eligible to a place in the **Summer** term beginning on or after **1 April**.

Once a child has started attending a setting the place will remain valid until they move onto an Early Education place for 3- and 4-year-olds.
