

Early Learning Funding – Working Parents

Working parents who meet the relevant eligibility criteria may be able to claim up to 30 hours government funded childcare for children aged 9 months+ up until they start school (Reception Class).

N.B. Children need to have turned 9 months on or before the termly deadlines of **31 August, 31 December or 31 March** to be eligible for the respective terms. For example, for a child to start a 9 month place in **September**, they need to have been born before **31st November** the previous year.

Childcare must be taken up with an approved childcare provider.

To be eligible, each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible.

All eligibility codes need to be applied for or re-verified via the website [Best Start in Life](#) by the following deadline dates in order to be eligible for the relevant term:

- **Autumn Term** – deadline **31 August** to be eligible for a funded place in the term beginning on or after **1 September**
- **Spring Term** – deadline **31 December** to be eligible for a funded place in the term beginning on or after **1 January**
- **Summer Term** - deadline **31 March** to be eligible for a funded place in the term beginning on or after **1 April**

Please note: The actual local authority terms don't always start on the first of September, January or April. Please visit [Together for Children website](#) for the Sunderland school term dates.
